Pip & Emma are twin scarflettes that highlight Knit Picks Chroma in two different ways. Characters from one of my favorite Miss Marple mysteries, Pip and Emma are twin sisters separated in childhood. When they are reunited as adults, the girls appear to have absolutely nothing in common, despite their essential relationship. As I was playing with stitch patterns and yarns, the different personalities of the scarflettes reminded me of sisters!



Pip is the tomboy, down-to-earth and loves the rich neutral of bittersweet heather while Emma craves color and pretty details. They are related by the unique folding and seaming method that creates the whimsical shape of a French silk scarf and can be positioned several ways. Each scarflette is reversible and calls for a single ball of Chroma—ideal for a quick gift for yourself, your bestie, or your long-lost twin who may be lurking nearby unbeknownst to you!

Sizing

Both Patterns

One size fits most. For a looser scarflette, work a few inches longer than the recommended 19.5 inches. For a snugger scarflette, work fewer inches.

Hook Size

Both Patterns

Size G (4.0 mm)

Yarn Requirements

Pip

Knit Picks Chroma Worsted; 70% wool, 30% nylon; 198 yards/100 grams; Bittersweet Heather #25265; 1 ball

Emma

Knit Picks Chroma Worsted; 70% wool, 30% nylon; 198 yards/100 grams; Pegasus #25249; 1 ball

Gauge

Pip

Single Crochet Rib Stitch Pattern

16 sts & 11 rows = 4 in/10 cm

Emma

Posy Stitch Pattern

16 sts & 10 rows = 4 in/10 cm

Pip Scarflette



Ch 41.

Sc-tbl in 2nd chain from the hook and in each ch across...40 sc-tbl.

Pattern Row: Ch 1, sc-tbl in each st across, turn.

Rep pattern row until piece measures 19.5 inches (49.5 cm) from chain edge; fasten off leaving a 12 in (30.5 cm) tail. Proceed to finishing instructions.

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Emma Scarflette



Ch 38.

Set-up Row: Hdc into 4th ch from hk, skip 1 ch, *work 2 hdc in next ch, skip 1 ch; rep from * across, ending with 2 hdc in last ch.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as 1 hdc + 1 ch), hdc in 1st st, skip 1 st, * work 2 hdc in next st, skip 1 st; rep from * across, ending with 2 hdc in last st.

Rep Row 1 until piece measures 19.5" from beginning. Fasten off leaving a 12 in (30.5 cm) tail. Proceed to finishing instructions.

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Finishing

Both Patterns



Step 1: Lay scarflette out lengthwise as pictured.

Step 2: Fold upper right side down as pictured.

Step 3: Fold lower left side up to meet upper right side as pictured.

Step 4: Using the 12 in (30.5 cm) tail you left, sew a 4 in (10 cm) seam where the two edges meet.

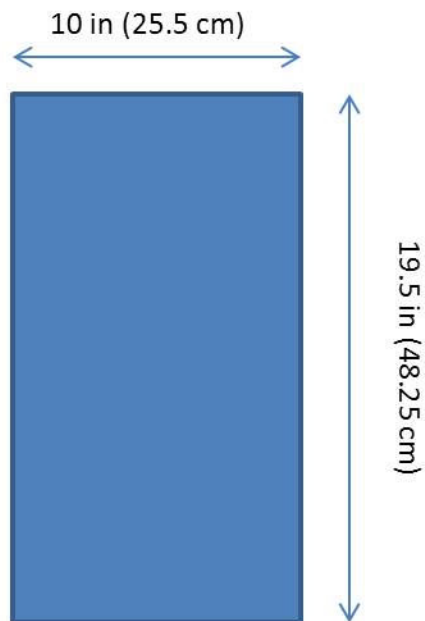
Step 5: Weave in yarn ends.

Step 6: Slip scarflette on over your head and fold down the upper lapel.

Step 7: Position as desired and wear with style!
